How they scored. . .

After winning the (coin) toss, UCLA was unable to capitalize after receiving the opening kickoff. UCLA punted, and Nebraska sustained a time-consuming 63-yard scoring drive. Tony Davis carried the ball seven times for 23 yards and Ritch Babe sprinted for an additional 19 yards, setting up quarter back Steve Runty's touchdown sneak with 7:53 left in the first quarter. Rich Sanger's point-after-touchdown (PAT) was good, and Nebraska led 7-0.

With 6:13 left in the first quarter, Randy Borg ramblled 77 yards on a punt return touchdown, adding another six points to Nebraska's total. Sanger's PAT was good for a 14-0 lead.

UCLA recovered a fumble to set up their first score. Halfback Kermit Johnson went up the middle 12 yards for the touchdown. The PAT attempt by Efen Herrera was no good, so with 1:14 remaining in the first quarter, Nebraska led 14-6.


On Nebraska's next possession, Runty threw a touchdown pass to Frosty Anderson with 13:36 left in the half, capping a 77-yard drive. The PAT was blocked, leaving Nebraska ahead 20-6.

With 11 seconds remaining in the first half, UCLA completed a 72-yard drive on quarterback Mark Harmon's one-yard plunge. Herrera's PAT was good, and UCLA cut Nebraska's lead to 20-13.

The Huskers combined the running of Davis and Maury Damkroger and the passing of Runty to give the Huskers a 26-13 lead with 8:05 left in the quarter. Davis scored the touchdown, and Sanger's PAT was blocked again.

Another Husker 80-yard drive was ended by Davis' 43-yard touchdown romp with 13:22 remaining in the game. Sanger's PAT was good, and the Huskers led 33-13.

The final score of the contest came with 2:19 left in the game. Jeff Moran picked up the six points with a 3-yard dash into the end zone. Sanger's PAT was good, giving Nebraska a 40-13 victory. The PAT by Sanger gave him 165 career points, a new Husker record, surpassing the old kick scoring mark of 154 set by Paul Rogers.
