Intramural program expands; adds water festival, bike rally

"We have always received a favorable response to our intramural program, and this year we look for even more participation than ever," men's intramural coordinator Phil Sienna said.

He said that in the two years he has directed intramurals at UNL, the program has grown about 40 per cent. "People claim that intramurals are on the decline. We have facts and figures that say differently," Sienna said. The intramural program has been expanded to 32 sports this year. The season opened Tuesday with flag football and

will close in April.

New events scheduled this year include innertube water basketball, punt, pass and kick competition, a bicycle rally, a basketball marathon, one-on-one basketball competition and a water festival that includes water basketball and water polo.

Also new this year is Class C intramural competition for

some sports. "Class C teams provide a lower caliber of play (than A or B teams), but the participants always have a good time," Sienna said.

One of Sienna's summer projects was defining intramural eligibility regulations. The new rules limit the intramural participation of athletes who compete on UNL teams.

Frosh 'thumped' in varsity clash

Although the freshman football team got "thumped pretty good" Monday in its first scrimmage against varsity third- and fourth-stringers, Husker frosh coach Jim Ross said he is still satisfied with his squad's progress.

"We started off badly," Ross said of the scrimmage, "and then played a little better as the game wore on. But that's pretty typical of the first scrimmage against the varsity."

An inter-squad scrimmage Friday was partly rained out, Ross said, but the Monday action provided a highlight for his freshmen, who don't begin their season until Sept. 28 at Kansas State.

"We brought the kids back for fall camp a little earlier this year because of the early opening date for school," he explained. "Things are starting to get a little old for us right now, but every freshman team has the problem."

The Kansas State game will mark the first time that the freshmen have opened their season in September.

Ross said the linemen and defensive ends continue to look like a strong point for his squad and that a few adjustments have also strengthened the offensive line.

Running backs Dave Justice and Dave Gillespie, who had been practicing with the varsity, have now joined the freshmen and have improved the offensive backfield, Ross said.

Almost half of the 75-man freshman squad are walk-on, non-scholarship athletes, a larger number than usual, Ross said. He singled out several walk-ons who have impressed the frosh coaching staff.

Backs Kirk Gammart, Kirk Stacey, Tim Borg and Doug Forstrom, linebackers Jeff Pullen and Ben Siebler, center Steve Gade and linemen Dennis Clark, Gary Buttermore and Larry Shupe all "have a good chance to play a whole lot for us," Ross said.

The freshmen played their final scrimmage against the varsity third- and fourth-stringers next week.
