

Art library to lend prints Saturday

If you're a student, you can borrow a print of a famous painting to distinguish your walls this semester.

The Union Art Lending Library opens at 11 a.m. Saturday in the Nebraska Union. Prints can be kept until mid-December without cost.

This year, according to Rae Jean Lewandowski, art lending library chairperson, there are 280 prints available, 31 of them new. Most of the new prints are American and Oriental works.

Lewandowski said the prints include classical, romantic, impressionist, and modern abstract works.

The prints were bought from the New York Graphic Society with \$875 of student fee money. Buying one of these prints yourself with a comparable frame would cost at least \$60, Lewandowski said.

Persons who are choosy about the prints they want should be at the Union by 9:30 or 10 a.m. at the latest, Lewandowski said. "It's like general registration all over again," she added, saying that lines form early and the prints go quickly.

Students must have their student I.D. to check out prints.

Film features black musicians

Sunday at 3 p.m. the Sheldon Film Theater will present the second film of its Lively Arts Series.

Black Music in America: From Then Until Now features filmed performances of such important black musicians as Louis Armstrong, Mahalia Jackson, B.B. King, Leadbelly and Bessie Smith.

The premise of the film is that the history of the black man's music is in effect the history of the black man in America. The musical performances are interspersed with woodcuts showing this history.

The film is free. Future Lively Arts films will include *The Mime of Marcel Marceau*, *Walter Kerr on Theater*, *Film: The Art of the Impossible* and others. The films are sponsored by the UNL Instructional Media Center.

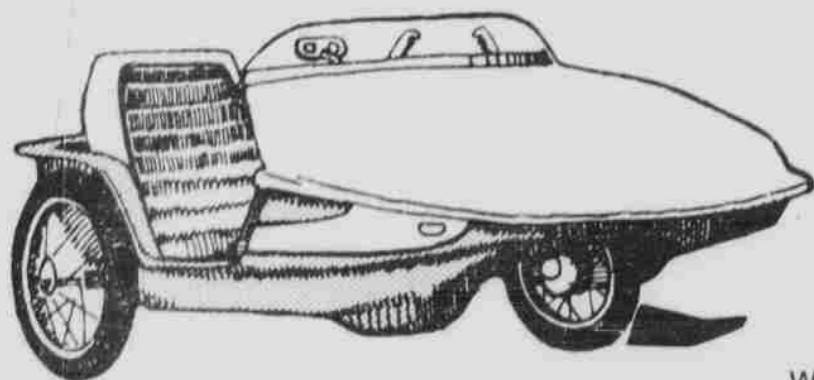
