

## Huskers pound mock Wolfpack

Friday's scrimmage was a high scoring affair, with Nebraska beating North Carolina State, 42-6.

Nebraska's top two offensive units, directed by alternating quarterbacks Steve Runty and Dave Humm, scored seven times against the Huskers' third and fourth defensive units using Wolfpack formations.

Quarterback Glen Ray then guided the Huskers' third offensive unit to a touchdown against the Nebraska Black Shirts.

"That was a little discouraging," Osborne said of the score against the Black Shirts. "But I don't think it will be indicative of the game."

Osborne said the first-string offense looked all right, but that they should score every time against the third team defense. The offense scored seven of the nine times it had the ball.

Commenting on the Runty-Humm situation, Osborne said that both players did some "good things."

"We'll look at the scrimmage films and watch both players every day," he said. "Then we'll make our decision on who will start later this week."

In scores from around the Big Eight, Oklahoma crushed Baylor 42-14, Missouri shut out Mississippi 17-0, Oklahoma State's wishbone ran over the University of Texas-Arlington 56-7 and Kansas handled Washington State 29-8. Kansas State traveled to Gainesville and lost to Florida 21-10 and Colorado fell to Louisiana State University at Baton

## NCAA plans drug tests

Because of the increasing problem of drug use among participants in college sports, athletes in National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) competition may be subject to random drug tests this fall, said Dr. Samuel Fuenning, medical director of the University Health Center.

"Right now the drug plan is in a developmental stage," Fuenning said. "But it might be carried out before some crucial intercollegiate athletic event this fall."

Once the plan is put into effect, it will consist of administering urinalysis and other tests before games which will primarily look for the presence of amphetamines, Fuenning said.

"The tests will try to pinpoint the drugs which have a definite bearing on an athlete's performance or which alters his physiological functions," he said.

If an illegal drug is found, an athlete could be disqualified or an entire team may have to forfeit a game, Fuenning said. However, according to the NCAA, the tests would not lead to punishment but would be used only to gather facts which will provide the NCAA with future direction in fighting drug abuse.

Top-ranked Southern California had more trouble than expected with Arkansas, but shut out the Razorbacks 17-0. Third-ranked Ohio State demolished Minnesota, an Oct. 6 Husker opponent, 56-7, fourth-ranked Texas was idle, and fifth-ranked Michigan beat Iowa 31-7.

Alabama, holding the No. 6 slot, opened their season with a 66-0 blasting of California, seventh-ranked Penn State handled Stanford 20-6, eighth-ranked Notre Dame was idle, and ninth-ranked Tennessee edged Duke 21-17.

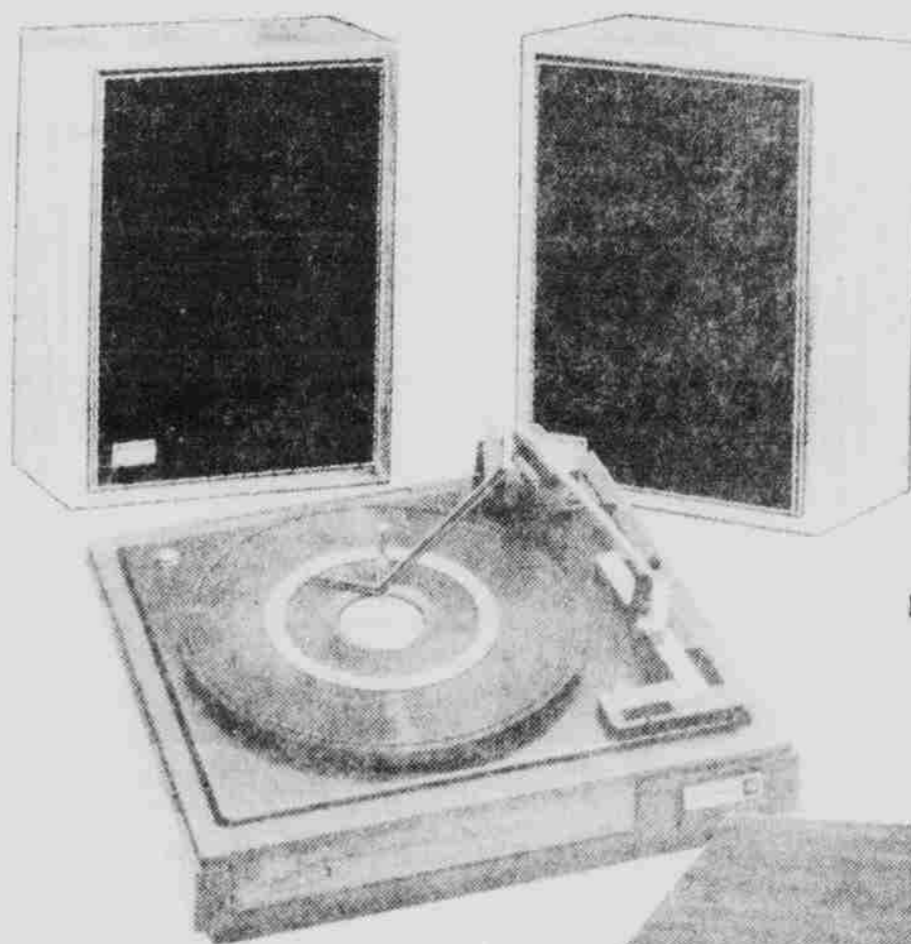
Saturday's Husker opponent, North Carolina State, picked up its second straight win with a 43-23 victory over Virginia.
