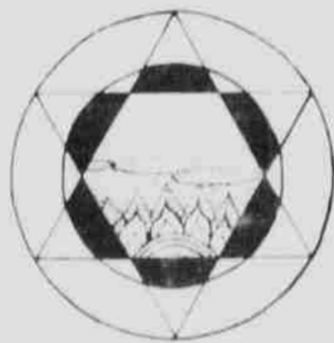

IFC contract states pledge guarantees

The Interfraternity Council (IFC) has reinstated the pledge education contract this year to re-emphasize to Greeks and independents what the contract is, according to Dave McBride, IFC president.

McBride said the contract was abolished a few years ago because most fraternities already had rules and bylaws, whether local or national, that said the same things.

"Many of the fraternities believed the contract wasn't needed since they had these rules already, but the general opinion of non-Greeks was that pledges were discriminated against," McBride said.

The contract states that pledges are guaranteed certain rights such as a minimum of three hours of undisturbed study daily, no pledge activities after midnight, no hazing according to the bylaws of IFC, no personal servitude and orientation to UNL. If a fraternity violates the contract, the name of any person making a report will not be revealed.

The situation was brought to IFC's attention by a number of persons and by an editorial in the *Daily Nebraskan* last spring on pledge hazing, McBride said.

"With all the people outside the Greek system watching us now, IFC thought it better to go back to the pledge contract. Not that there is that big of a problem, but we don't want to mislead anyone," McBride said.

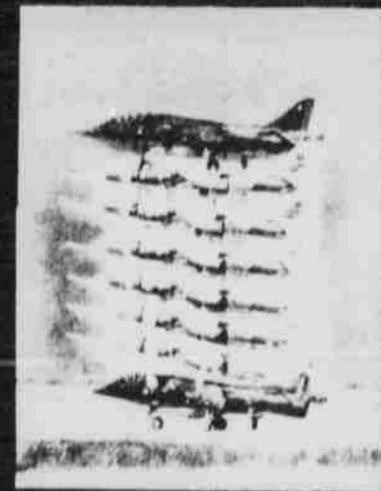
