urges students to obey the laws of the state and nation, but an inconsistency arises when these statements are compared to actual practice.

In practice, the University policy to the present has been similar to the unwritten attitude toward the student in

the early 1900s, which was to control student life according to what they thought the parents would do.

Whereas the handbooks profess a belief that students should obey the laws of the state and nation, students have been kept from taking on the responsibility that the change in laws embody.

Laws governing the legal age of voting and drinking have been changed in the

past few years. An amendment was made to the constitution allowing 18-year-olds the right to vote. The Legislature passed a bill lowering the legal drinking age to 19, drinking age to 19.

These changes have had their effect by recognizing the students as mature adults. It is as important for responsibility to be taken and used by students as it is to be given and shared by the University and state.

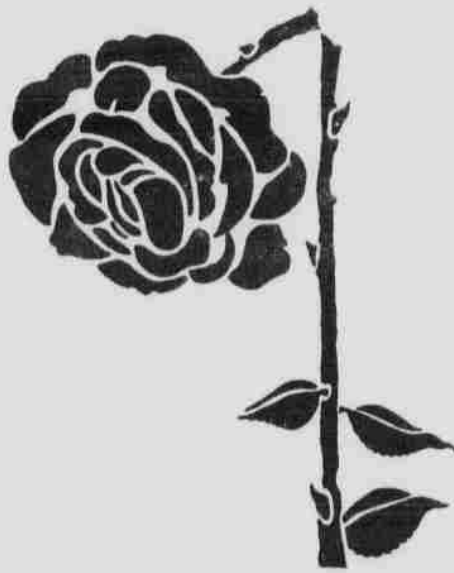
