The ASUN Senate inched closer to implementation of the Legal Aid for Students office. The senate nominated two Lincoln attorneys Wednesday to fill the part-time student lawyer post. The two men, Bruce Hamilton and Douglas German, are wise choices for the position. Both are young and, as former Legal Aid attorneys, have experience in the sort of cases students frequently face.


The nominations now go before the Board of Regents for approval. If approved, the men would share a yearly salary of \$9,370 which would be paid by ASUN out of student fee money. When the year is over, the effectiveness and usefulness of the position will be avaluated.

The Board of Regents should approve the nominees, but for eight months instead of one year. That way, the project could be evaluated during the summer, and, if it fails, it could be discontinued. Possible early discontinuation could save ASUN more than \$3,000.

The senate acted wisely in selecting such talented men for the positions. The Board of Regents now should act in ASUN's best interest and offer a shorter contract to the lawyers.

Man's Voice: I'll never get caught (click-bleep)


with bad breath. What is a Watergate?'
