# Minority students complain to CSL

Following the two hours of dialogue, Council on Student Life (CSL) members and UNL minority students Thursday came up with several suggestions for improving the situation for minority students on campus.

About 20 minority students attended the council's open forum held at the Cultural Center, and voiced their complaints about campus life.

"There's just not enough importance placed on the things that minority students like to do," student Leannette Merrill said. Activities sponsored by campus living units do not appeal to minority students, she said, and few white students attend cultural weeks sponsored by minority groups to show the white population their cultures.

Minority students feel alienated on the UNL campus, Merrill said. "Even if there were only one black student on this campus and the university failed to meet his needs, then it couldn't claim to be functioning effectively," she added.

"We're concerned about the little things that make a person feel relaxed, things that make him feel worthwhile," James Smith, assistant director of minority affairs, said.

Minority students often are discriminated against in subtle ways—even in the looks they receive from other students, he said.

Suggestions made by CSL members and minority students included:

- Developing a more active recruitment program to bring more minority students to UNL.

- Hiring more minority faculty and staff members and offering them chances for promotion. "Too often the entry level (for minority employes) is the freeze level," Smith said.

- Providing libraries with books of interest to minority students.

- Hiring minority staff members in the Office of Student Affairs, instead of placing them only in Minority Affairs.

- Encouraging minority students to become involved in student government and to serve on university committees.

- Enforcing university rules and those made by campus organizations equally for both white and nonwhite students.

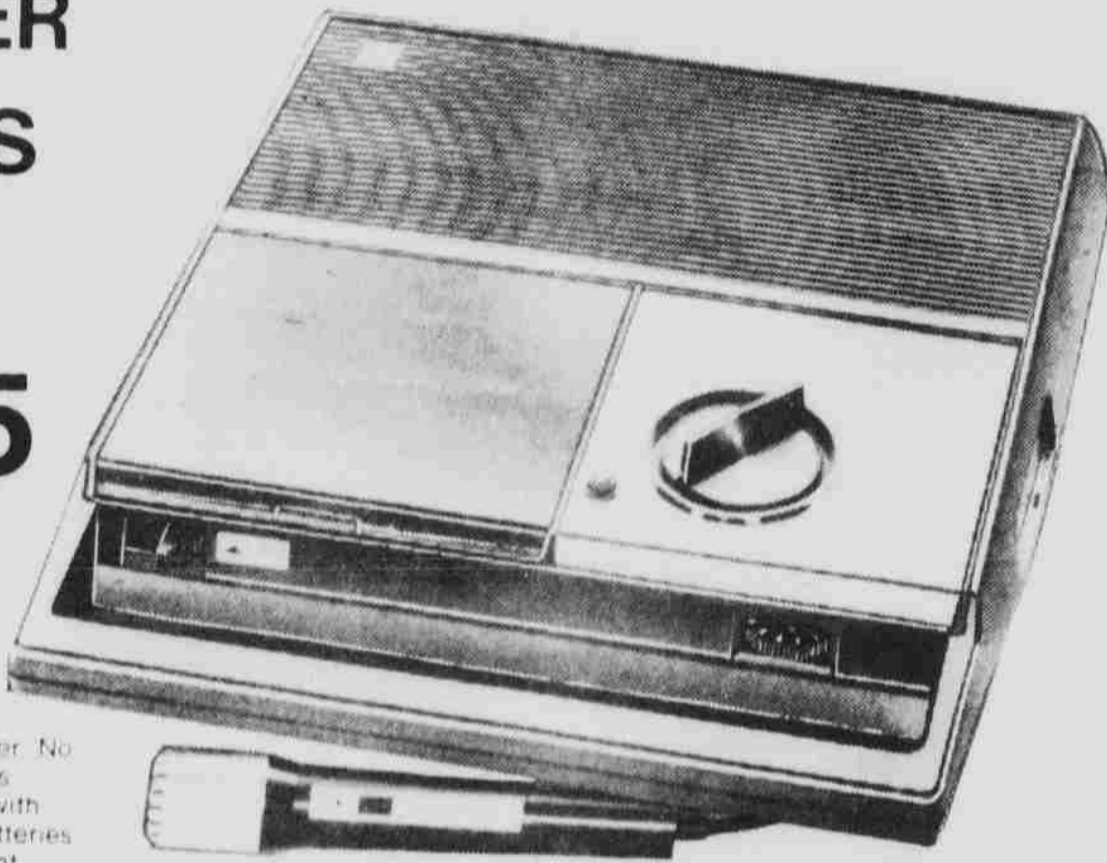

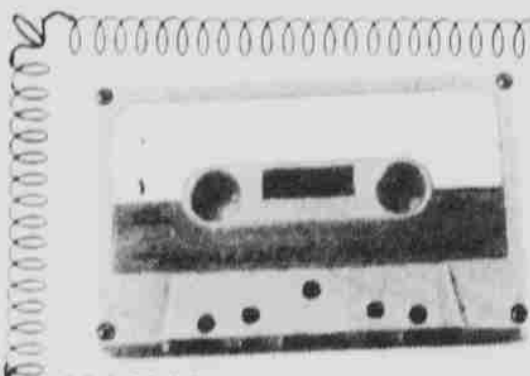
