### The Seven Minutes

- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 1 tsp. fresh curry powder
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 1 c. milk
- ¼ tsp. salt
- 1 small or medium can of tuna, salmon, mackerel, or deviled ham.

Melt the butter in a fondue pot or other suitable pot. Add flour and curry powder; stir until well mixed. Slowly stir in milk and salt, then add the meat. Stir over medium flame until contents are hot, serve over toast, dry bread or whatever is on hand (crackers work well). This serves one overpoweringly, two comfortably, three adequately or four as a snack.
