Backed with 37 returning lettermen, 12 of whom were starters last year, the 1973 Colorado Buffalos today will seek their first win over Nebraska since 1967.

The Huskers, winners of nine of the last ten games played between these conference rivals, enter their eighth game with a 5.1-1 record, while Colorado is 5.2 on the year.

Colorado's offense will be guided by sophomore quarterback Clyde Crutchmer. Starting running backs will be seniors Charlie Davis (tailback) and Bo Matthews (fullback).


