**Probation
possible
for Army
ROTC**

The 100th anniversary of military science training at UNL could be beset with the Army ROTC program being placed on probation due to a lack of recruits.

Col. Robert J. Pazderka, chairman of UNL Army ROTC, Thursday said the program is obliged to turn out 12 officers a year to keep the venture a profitable one for the Army. If the number is not met, the department will be placed on probation for two years. If it does not commission enough officers during that time, the Army would consider removing the ROTC program from the university.

If the current slow rate of commissions continues, Pazderka predicts the required number will not be met in 1976, a century after military science first was offered on this campus.

Enrollment of cadets has dropped steadily in recent years. In 1968-69 there were 469; in 1970-71 there were 212; last year the number fell to 146 and this year it is 83.

"We have completely overhauled ROTC," Pazderka said. The program now gives a cadet a better chance to take the knowledge he has acquired and apply it in the field, he said.

Since Pazderka has taken over as head of the ROTC program, an expanded recruiting program has been instituted.

"Last year we sent out 20,000 letters, and this year we'll probably send 40,000," he said.

The reason for the sudden need for publicity of the program, according to Pazderka, is that the attitude of young persons is moving away from the armed forces in reaction to the Vietnam conflict. He said the conflict left "a bad taste in their mouths."

All UNL males were required to take at least two years of ROTC until the Board of Regents placed it on a voluntary basis in the spring of 1964. Enrollment dropped off immediately.
