Rita termed her class a success because "just showing one of those women to the Women's Resource Center, is enough to make it a success."

Some courses fall through because of lack of response or scheduling problems.

A course on meal planning, organized by Vernon Dunn, met with conflicts in finding a kitchen, she said. But if there is enough interest, she said she intends to try teaching it again this semester.

One course, "Beginning a Community Radio Station," was taught by Bill Locke, a member of Sunrise Communications, Inc.

Sunrise is trying to set up a non-profit, non-commercial, educational community radio station, Locke said. They used the Free University course to interest more people in the process of organizing a station.

"We only had three meetings. Fifteen people showed up and I was really enthused, but they wanted different things," he said. "Some of them thought that we would teach them how to run a radio station. We were not organized to do that, we just needed volunteers to help us get equipment and subscriptions."

Despite this, at least five of the 15 started to come to the regular Sunrise meetings "and have done some really good work," Locke said.

Not all classes even had a slight success.

Jan Norris, a sophomore who tried to organize a conversational German session, found that most students "just wanted another German class. They started to bring their assignments to me to check over. It completely debased the whole philosophy of the Free University."

"The Free University system is good, real good," said Kumm. "There just has to be the individual determination in the people who take part. Those who stay learn something," she said.
