A.S.U.N. ELECTIONS

MARCH 13

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT:

Preamble: We, the students of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, realizing the need for a more effective Student Association hereby establish this Interim constitution to provide for an orderly transition to a new permanent constitution.

Article I Name

The name of this organization shall be the Association of Students of the University of Nebraska of Lincoln, herein referred to as ASUN.

Article II Purposes

The primary purpose of this interim organization shall be the drafting and establishment of a new permanent constitution for ASUN.

It shall also act in a custodial capacity in the administration of the existing functions of ASUN.

Article III Membership

All regularly enrolled students in the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, shall be members of the Association and shall be entitled to take part in all activities of the Association as herein after outlined.

Article IV Powers

Section 1. Establishing a new ASUN Constitution

The interim organization shall take such steps as necessary to draft and present to the student body for approval a new ASUN Constitution.

Section 2. Custodial Powers

A. Powers Relating to Organizations

- To recognize all proposed new student organizations and to approve their constitutions, without which recognition and approval an organization shall not be permitted to function.
- To establish, by majority vote of the Board of Trustees, new and uniform conditions for the continued approval of existing student organizations, to demand compliance with said new conditions within a reasonable and stated length of time, and to revoke, by conviction in Student Court, the constitutions and right to function of organizations failing to comply.
- To schedule and/or conduct all student elections of general University interest, not excluding those for contests sponsored by subordinate organizations.
- To make all student appointments to UNL committees, boards, and other appointed positions on campus organizations.

B. Powers Relating to Ad Hoc Assemblies

- To organize and/or control all student rallies or demonstrations.
- To organize and/or control all student migrations.

C. Powers Relating to Removal or Disqualification

- To suspend or dismiss from office, by conviction in Student Court, any student executive of the government of the Association who shall refuse to carry its legislation into effect.
- To disqualify, suspend or dismiss from Association office, for a stated length of time, by conviction of the Student Court, any student who shall violate duly-enacted ordinances, regulations or other legislation of the Association.

D. Powers Relating to Liaison

- To serve as liaison between students and faculty, between students and the Board of Regents and/or their representatives, between students and the state legislature, and between students and the general public at such time as the general welfare of the students and/or the University shall require such service.

E. Powers Relating to General Welfare

- To exercise any other powers necessary for the general welfare of the students

Article V. STRUCTURE

Section I Board of Trustees

A. Composition

- The Board shall consist of 38 elected ASUN representatives of the 1974 election and the faculty advisor.
- The Board shall elect persons to fill any vacancies when deemed necessary.

B. Format of the Board of Trustees

- Chairman—the position of Chairman of the Board shall be filled by the person elected as "President" in the 1974 election.
- The chairman's duties shall be:
 - presiding chairman of the Board with vote
 - to perform the necessary administration functions as head of the Association
 - to fill the role of student body president
- Two Vice-Chairman—the position of Vice-Chairmen of the Board shall be filled by the persons elected as "Second Vice-President" in the 1974 election. The duties of the Vice-Chairmen shall be designated by the Board.
- Duties and Power of the Board:
 - to draft a new permanent ASUN Constitution
 - establish its own procedures and rules for administration and policy making
 - to, if deemed necessary, remove the chairman and/or vice-chairmen by a two-thirds vote
 - to prepare if necessary an annual budget for submission to the Fee Allocations Board

Section 2. Interim Student Court:

A. Composition

- The interim student court shall be composed of the persons appointed to the "student court" by the '73-74 senate.

B. Judicial Powers

- The judicial power of the Student Court shall extend to the following controversies:
 - matters of impeachment
 - matters of interpretation of this constitution
 - matters of contested elections
 - matters concerning organizations when referred to the Court by the University of Nebraska Administration, the Student Senate, or an individual student.

C. The appeal of any decision of the court shall go to the Council on Student Life.

Article IV Ratifying New Constitution

Section I Publication

- Any new constitution drafted by the Board shall be submitted to the student body for approval and must be published in the Daily Nebraskan at least 3 times prior to the referendum at no less than one week intervals.

Section II Ratification

- The new constitution shall become effective upon the affirmation vote of a simple majority of at least 15% of the student body

Section III Failure to establish new constitution

- If a new constitution is not in effect by November 15, 1974, the constitution in effect on March 7, 1974, will again be in effect.
