Prof to seek German talent

Roger Welsch, NU assistant professor of English, is going to Germany for three weeks starting Aug. 26 as the guest of the Federal German Republic and as a representative of the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C.

Welsch, who teaches folklore at NU, is one of eight Americans who have been assigned the task of seeking "folk-talent" representative of Germany for participation in next year's "Folk Festival on the Mall" in Washington. The folk festival annually brings representatives of cultures from throughout the world to the nation's capital for demonstrations of singing, dancing,

and various crafts and arts.

Welsch said that next year's festival to be held in July, will last three weeks. An important part of the festival, Welsch said, is the inclusion of what is termed a cognate communitymeaning a community drawn from within the United States which has its roots in an overseas culture such as that of Germany, Japan, or Ireland. After his return from Germany, Welsch will be involved in the formation of a representative cognate community and is hopeful that he will be able to draw upon people in the Northern plains including Nebraska, for participation in the
