

## 'Labels must not hide help'

The key to student development is translation, the new Dean of Student Development told the *Daily Nebraskan*.

Ely Meyerson said students must be able to translate division titles into tools for themselves.

"Placement," "Student Activities," and "Counseling Center" divisions exist to help students in their out-of-class needs, he said.

To make them work, their offerings must be visible and accessible to students.

"There's so much there, a heck of a lot more than it appears," he said.

For example, Scholarships and Financial Aids is part of his new duties.

That office will be especially important to out-state students whose parents, through the summer drought, lost money intended for school costs, he said.

The Counseling Center offers seminars, information and friendly counseling for any student's problems, he said.

Meyerson became Dean of Student Development after confirmation by the NU Board of Regents at its July meeting. He will administrate the department's budget.

Meyerson replaces Acting Director Hal Smith. Smith will be associate dean in charge of Student Activities, Conduct Referrals and special projects.

Meyerson will be directly responsible for Placement, the Counseling Center, Scholarships and Financial Aids, Recreation, Fraternities, Sororities and Cooperatives, and the International Student Office.

Student Activities, Recreation and the Counseling Center are financed with student fees. The others are financed with tax money or special grants.

Meyerson said his position is a new one created by joining two co-directors, one for programs and one for services.

Smith directed programs. Harry Cannon, now vice president of student affairs at Northern Illinois University, directed services.

Meyerson said the department combined the positions because it appeared the move would save money and increase coordination of work.

Meyerson had been dean of administration for Kenneth Bader, vice chancellor of student affairs for UNL.
