## August 1975 finish set for sports complex

Visitors to the Nebraska State Fair this week may have had difficulty believing that the web-like steel skeleton, UNL's new sports complex, will be completed a year from now.

The planned August 1975 completion date is realistic, yet some-

what optimistic, according to Harley Schrader, UNL physical plant administrator.

The project, which originally was to be finished by January 1975, seemed doomed to delay from the start. Funding the complex by cigarette taxes met controversy

from the public and was the subject of a debate in the Legislature.

Once construction started, a shortage of materials, (especially steel), a shortage of skilled labor, due to an increase in heavy construction in downtown Lincoln and bad working weather slowed progress, Schrader said.

## SI predicts Nebraska behind Ohio, Oklahoma

Sports Illustrated (SI) magazine's ratings for the top twenty football teams for 1974 are out.

This year's choice for national champion is Ohio State University and the publication devotes most of the college football section to the Buckeyes.

Nebraska is sixth in SI's predictions while the Oklahoma Sooners are number two. Another Big 8 team, Missouri, is 12th.

Last year, Sports Illustrated had the Huskers 12th and picked Texas to win the national championship.

The section on Nebraska features this quote from Tom Osborne: "There is little difference between 11-0, or 10-1 and 7-4 or 6-5 in the Big 8. We'll be good, but I don't know whether we'll be the former or the latter."

Earlier in the week, Nebraska was forecast seventh in the AP pre-season poll.
