Football game feature for Masters' alumni

UNL alumni taking part in Masters' Week this year will attend a Nebraska football game, thanks to the Innocents and Mortar Board, two UNL honorary groups.

Masters' Week, which is usually conducted in the spring, has been moved to November 13-15, so that among the other changes on campus, alumni will see how the football team has progressed.

Blaine Camp, who is in charge of Masters' Week and is Innocent's secretary-treasurer, said Masters' Week is the biggest project in terms of time and importance that the Innocents and Mortar Board will undertake this year.

"It's a lot of work arranging this thing. It will take up most of our time this fall, but it's a good thing for the campus," he said.

Ginger Farley, treasurer of the Mortar Board, agreed. "It's a marvelous idea to bring back alumni. It allows both students and the alumni to learn and understand a little bit more about themselves and UNL," she said.

Mortar Board, composed of 28 senior women selected on the basis of leadership and scholastic record, also will work with the Innocents on a legislative and regent's dinner to be held in February, Farley said.

Other plans for Mortar Board include working on Ivy Day and finding a junior girl to receive the Dean Helen Schneider Memorial scholarship, she said.

Innocents, 14 senior men selected by the same criteria as Mortar Board, are planning either a Halloween or Christmas party to be given for a local orphanage, Camp said.

"Another big job for us will be to update the files and addresses of the Innocents alumni and to generally reorganize the information we have," he said.

Camp said the Innocents also will sponsor an award ceremony during half-time of the Missouri-Nebraska football game.

"I'm not quite sure what the ceremony is," Camp said. "But a bell was stolen from a school or church in Lincoln and every year we award it to last year's winning team during half-time. It gives us a great chance to wear our red capes."

Innocents will award two scholarships later this fall. Officers of Mortar Board are president, Lori Chase; treasurer, Ginger Farley; secretary, Nan Lueder; and historian, Sara LeRoy.

Officers of Innocents are Jack Mayfield, president; and Blaine Camp, secretary-treasurer.
