Why was the name "Campus Security" changed to "Campus Police"?

According to Patrolman Joe Wehner, Campus Police became Campus Security in the mid 60s to improve police-community relations. Last fall, Campus Security was changed back to Campus Police to make it clear that Campus Police is a law enforcement agency, Wehner said.

Money, manpower and equipment are easier to receive from federal agencies now that the name Campus Police is being used, Wehner said. Previously, the Nebraska State Crime Commission would not pay the \$525 tuition to send a policeman from "Security" to the Grand Island State Training Center because they considered security to mean guards and nightwatchman, he said.

Equipment for Campus Security was paid for by UNL but equipment for the Campus Police is paid for by the crime commission, Wehner said.

Campus policemen officially are deputy state sheriffs, Wehner said. Campus Police are a separate police entity and not part of the Lincoln Police Department, he said.

What is the extent of a Campus policeman's jurisdiction?

The main function of the Campus Police is to enforce state and municipal laws on the university campus, Wehner said.

East Campus, Main Campus and surrounding streets—mainly 16th, 17th, and Vine Streets are the areas covered by Campus Police, he said.

However, Wehner said, campus policemen have the right to do follow-up investigations and make arrests anywhere in Nebraska.

Campus Police could be called on by the Lincoln Police Department to assist them in an emergency but the possibility is "not likely," Wehner said.

Student job mart at Union Friday

A student job mart, with employment opportunities for permanent and temporary part-time positions with the university, will be Friday in the north lobby of the Nebraska Union.

The job mart, to be manned by the University Personnel Department and the University Maintenance Dept., will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Year-round jobs requiring a four-hour block of time five days a week in the area of campus maintenance will be available to qualified students. These include jobs as painters, plumbers, laborers, refrigeration specialists, carpenters and electricians.

"A few of these positions require as little as six months experience, while others require up to three years. Starting wage scales range from \$2.867 to \$3.640 per hour," said David J. Carlborn, assistant director of personnel.

Part-time temporary jobs include custodial positions and jobs as catering waiters and waitresses at the Nebraska Union. Hourly wages for these positions start from \$1.90 per hour.


