Compact or recycle?

Two methods of trash disposal for residence halls are being examined by the Housing Office to make garbage collection more efficient, according to Joseph Zannini, assistant director of housing.

Bill Schnackel, Cather-Pound-Neihardt residence halls complex program director, said he has researched a recycler that would crush paper or metal, to be sold to recycling centers. He said areas to store sorted trash would have to be found.

Zannini said, however, a trash compactor would be more efficient and economical than the recycler. Unsorted trash could be crushed and collected three times a week for each residence hall complex. Trash is now collected 11 times a week, according to Zannini.

He estimated equipment and construction costs would be \$24,000 for the four residence hall complexes, although no bids have been taken or equipment bought. Funds would come from the Housing Office's capital construction fund.
