The Ford Administration's economic and energy policies almost rerouted the 1974 migration football game at the ASUN Senate meeting Wednesday

By a vote of 17 to 7, senators rejected a resolution to set the Nebraska-Iowa State University game at Ames, Iowa as the migration game. The game is scheduled for Nov. 9, a week after the Nebraska-University of Colorado game at Boulder.

The Senate last spring determined the Colorado game to be the 1974 migration. A migration game is one the

Senator Doug Voegler who introduced the resolution said the move would be in keeping with the nation's current energy shortage and inflation.

'President Ford has called on the people in the nation to be economizers and energy savers," Voegler said.

An lowa migration game would save gas for students, as it would be only a four-hour drive to Ames, whereas the drive to Boulder takes eight hours,

Voegler said. With the shorter distance, students can drive back in the same day, saving accommodation expenses, Voegler said.

A less expensive migration game would allow middle-income students to attend the migration and not limit it to "the affluent sorority and fraternity people," Voegler said.

In addition, the resolution would potentally save the lives of students, by shortening the amount of time spent on highways, Voegler said.

Voegler said Jim Pittenger, UNL ticket manager had told him a change in migration would still be possible.

However, Delores Cleavenger, a Tassels representative told the Senate that the lottery for the Boulder game begins Monday. Tassels is a woman's spirit group on campus.

"You migrate for one day," Cleavenger said, referring to the proposed lowa

migration. "What is that?"
In other matters, the Senate approved the nomination of Rebecca Brite as Publications Board representative to the Fees Allocation Board. Brite is the Daily Nebraskan associate news editor.


