Coach Frank Sevigne said he wasn't too disappointed by his team's performance. He said the team ran well and showed improvement over the meet with Wisconsin the week before. Sevigne cited Whitaker for good performance. He also said improvement should continue as the young squad gains experience.


The harriers will meet Missouri this weekend.


Dear Sports Editor:
