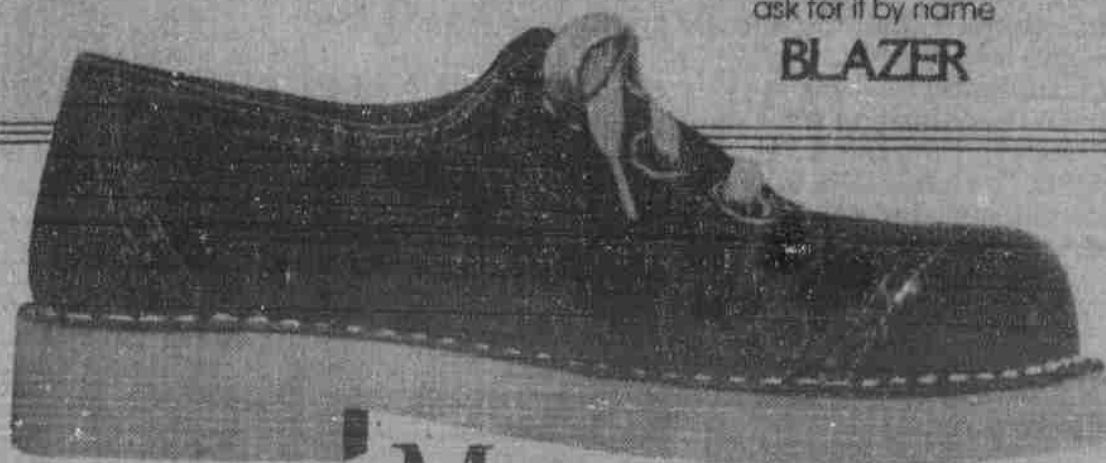

Flights and Study Tours

Going south, not east

You may have dreamed of traveling to Europe, but why not try something different, like going to South America?

During the 1975 spring pre-session (May 16 to June 5), University of Nebraska students may participate in a charter flight going to Lima, Peru and returning from Quito, Ecuador.

The South American trip is sponsored by the NU Extension Division, the Latin American Committee of the Institute for International Studies and NU Flights and Study Tours.

According to Evelyn Jacobsen, director of Flights and Study Tours, the tours previously went only to Europe. This will be the first South American trip sponsored by the group.

Jacobsen said students may earn course credit in conjunction with the trip, or simply take the trip itself.

40 per cent saving

Commercial air fare for a trip such as the South American excursion would range in price from \$631 to \$703 for a round trip ticket. The university charter flight fare is \$387 for round trip air fare, Jacobsen said.

"It is a saving of up to 40 per cent over regular air fare," she said.

Credit courses in dance, education, Spanish language and literature, zoology, economics, criminal justice, art and art history may be taken with the charter flight.

Student and faculty interest in traveling to places other than Europe was the generating force in making the South American charter a reality, Jacobsen said.

"If the South American charter is successful, then we (Flight and Study Tours) can offer tours to the Far East," she noted.

The winterim session (Dec. 26 to Jan. 12) charter flights to Europe are almost full, Jacobsen. The London flight has a waiting list of 20, while the Paris flight still has a few empty seats.

Summer charter

Jacobsen said students are more familiar with Europe; for that reason, the London and Paris tours have been very successful.

Firm plans for a two to three month 1975 summer charter to Europe for students have been made, Jacobsen said.

Registration for the South American trip begins prior to Thanksgiving break. Posters and flyers with course descriptions will be published in November, she said.
