Magic show in Omaha

Two UNL students will appear in a magic show in Omaha tonight at 8 p.m. The show is being given to raise money for the Omaha Magical Society and is part of the celebration of National Magic Week, Oct. 27 to Nov. 2.

Dave Madsen and Redge Johnson, the two students performing, both became interested in magic as children and have been performing ever since.

"Like every little kid, I wanted to be a magician," said Johnson. "Only I kept on being interested." Johnson says the number of shows he does varies from year to year. "I've done 10 to 15 shows a year, or as many as 50 a month," he said.

Madsen has done four shows so far this semester.

"I depend on word of mouth to help me get shows," he said. "I mainly do parties, Cub Scout meetings or banquets."

The show will be held in the St. Paul United Methodist Church on 54th and Corby streets in Omaha. Madsen and Johnson will be two of seven magicians performing at the show.

"We (the magicians) won't be paid for this show," Madsen said. "The money from admissions will go toward getting lecturers for our magical society meetings."
