UNL bicentennial goals outlined

The campus Bicentennial Committee has outlined its goals for the 1976 Bicentennial celebration and is now waiting for funding from the state Bicentennial Committee, according to Paul Olson, the group's chairman.

Olson said that after reviewing hundreds of suggestions from last year the committee has decided on three projects which it hopes to have completed by spring 1976.

A land use planning project has been designed to help people make better use of plants for decorative purposes, Olson said. But the project is currently without funds and its future is in doubt, he said.

According to Olson, the committee also is planning a project designed to bring attention to historic and ethnic conditions throughout the state. He said the committee is considering a proposal to convert a 30-car train into a museum on wheels which would travel throughout the state. The project also hopes to direct recognition to ethnic groups in the state, he said.

The third proposed project is aimed at "creating a network of grassroots

artists," Olson said. The project would feature musicians and artists from Nebraska in an arts and crafts program, he said. He added, however, that, like the other projects, the project is currently "in limbo" because of a lack of funds.

Olson said the committee is now reviewing faculty and student proposals for bicentennial projects. The requirement for projects, he said, is that they fall into one of the three categories designated by the committee.

Projects which the committee thinks are valuable are referred to the state Bicentennial Committee because there is no money available on campus, Olson said.

"We're opposed to the notion of huge amounts of money going for a celebration," Olson said. He said the committee is not interested in ideas that are solely celebration-oriented.

Projects that have a retrospective aspect and also a look to the future are what the committee is looking for, he said.
