Holiday plans not hurt by strike

All 28 students telephoned last week by the Daily Nebraskan said the national Greyhound Bus Lines strike will not affect their plans to go home for Thanksgiving break. Eight students said they will ride home with friends and 20 said they will drive their own cars. All students telephoned live in towns hit hardest by the strike.

The strike, called by the Amalgamated Transit Union, began Nov. 18 when a contract involving 16,000 Greyhound employees expired. It will continue for an undetermined length of time, said Bill Christian, Greyhound's area general manager in Omaha.

Five Greyhound employees are on strike in Lincoln and the bus terminal at 940 P St. is closed. Christian said closed-door negotiations will continue at

Greyhound headquarters in Phoenix, Ariz., until a settlement is reached.

Hardest hit by the strike are approximately 100 communities in Kansas, Missouri and southeastern Nebraska which are without bus service because they are not served by another line.

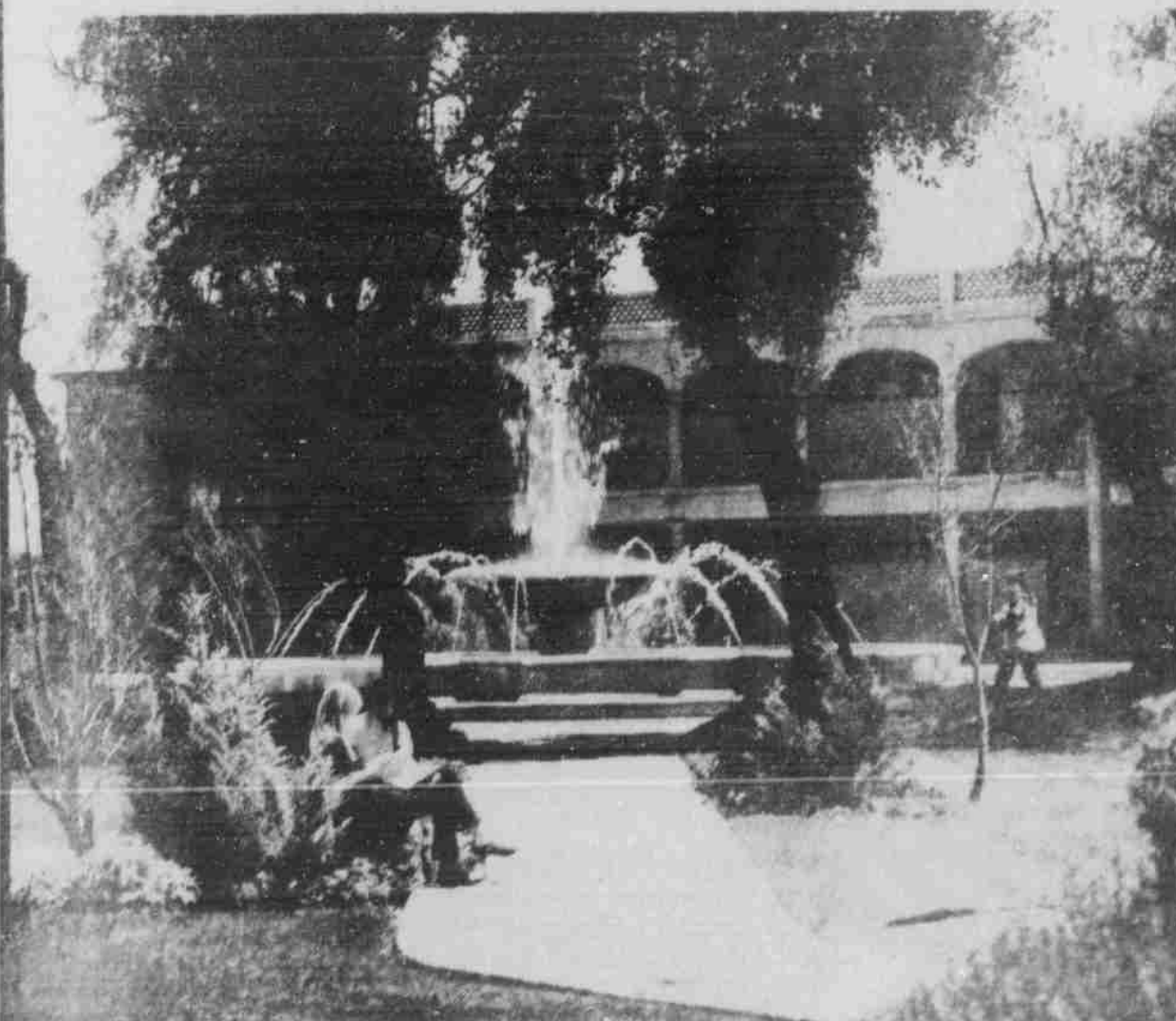
Nebraska towns affected include Plattsmouth, Nebraska City, Auburn and Falls City.

Christian said he didn't know how many UNL students use Greyhound, but competitor Continental Trailways is already seeing an increase of students riding their line, according to Lincoln terminal manager Ken Krupicka.

"Business hasn't quite doubled, but it definitely has increased," he said.
