

According to an article in The Omaha World-Herald yesterday, stu-dents at UNL may have elected the school's last homecoming queen.

In the article, Ken Bader, vice-chancellor of academic affairs questioned whether UNL students feel the election of a homecoming queen is worthwhile. "I just don't think that the idea of a queen appeals to the student body as a whole,"

Much of the controversy surrounding the homecoming queen began when Gary Brantz, a junior from Council Bluffs, was elected.

Brantz received the most votes in the election, but was disqualified because of alleged "campaign irregularities." After appealing to the Student Court, where he was confirmed as homecoming queen, he immediately returned the title to the reigning queen, Chris

Support of the contest has been withdrawn by Tassels, a sponsoring organization. According to Carolyn Grice, Tassels' president, the contest is too expensive for Tassels to sponsor:


