New SUN courses offered

The State University of Nebraska (SUN) will offer two new courses beginning March 2.

Milton J. Hassel, director of operations, said the SUN courses will include Accounting I and Introductory Psychology, plus the new Consumer Experience and Making It Count.

SUN is an experimental open-learning project using various media, to offer college study to people in their homes.

Hassel said "Consumer Experience"

includes 15 lessons like the other courses and will deal with a wide range of consumerism, from buying a car to preparing family budgets.

He said, "Making It Count," is a thorough introduction to computers and how they work. In addition, he said, it will cover what place computers have in

Hassel said the course is aimed primarily at those who have indirect with computers, such as contact

employes of banks and large companies. He said there are no admission requirements for the SUN courses. The costs of the courses, he said, are equivalent to on-campus course costs at

The course lessons will appear simultaneously on Sunday on the Nebraska Educational Television (NETV) and in The Omaha World-Herald, he said.

Hassel said additional instructional material will be mailed to the homes of those who enroll.
