SUN funds up for last vote

The Unicameral this week will hear 28 bills in committee and will vote on a number of others on final reading.

Final action will be taken Monday on LB537 which would earmark retroactively cash and revolving fund money for the State University of Nebraska (SUN), and on LB28, which would require insurance firms to provide health coverage for newborn babies.

The 28 bills which will be heard in committee this week include Gov. J. James Exon's proposal to retroactively raise the state income tax from 10 per cent to 13 per cent of the federal liability. The bill will be heard Monday by the Revenue Committee.

Thursday, Omaha Sen. Ernest Chambers' bill, LB424, to transfer the ownership of Ft. Robinson from the state to the Sioux-Indians is scheduled for hearing by the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee.

Other bills to be heard include one which would revise state laws on wiretaps, one which would provide increased retirement benefits for certain University of Nebraska (NU) retirees and 10 bills relating to the state liquor laws.

All committees meet at 2 p.m. unless otherwise noted.
