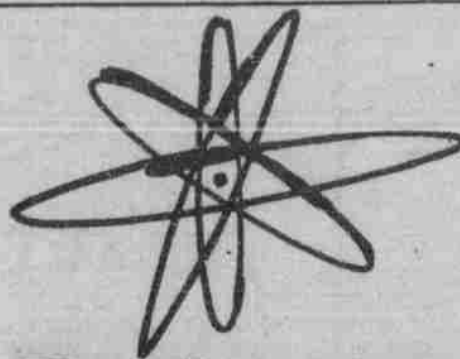
Kappa Alpha Psi will hold the drawing for their raffle Friday at 2:30 p.m. in Union 200.

Tickets sold for the original drawing will be honored but no additional raffle tickets are being sold.



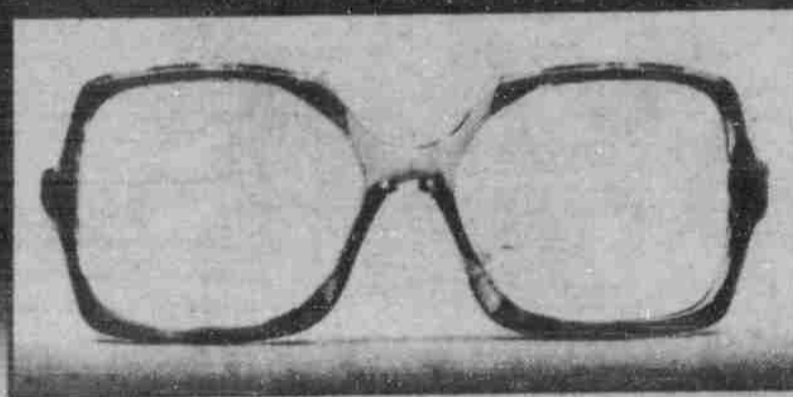
