# Sexual assault bill passed

The Nebraska Unicameral Thursday passed 44-0-5 a bill that redefines Nebraska's rape laws.

LB23, or the "sexual assault" bill introduced by Sen. Wally Barnett of Lincoln, met with no opposition on the floor in its final reading. The questionable material in the bill had been worked out previously in committee hearings and floor debate.

The bill substitutes the words "sexual assault" for the word "rape" in several places. The intent, as stated in the bill, is "to protect the dignity of the victim at all stages of the judicial process" and "to insure the alleged offender. . . the guaranteed due process of the law."

Mary Heppner, work-study coordinator for the UNL Women's Resource Center, said she was happy to see the bill passed.

"We worked a lot with the Lincoln Coalition Against Rape on this bill," she said. "The center did a lot of letter writing. We also did some personal lobbying, with about 25 or 30 people talking to state senators."

Heppner said the proposed law is an improvement since it removes some archaic terms from state statutes and substitutes more complete, definable terms.

There is also a spousal section which may make Nebraska the first state to have such a law, she said.

"I thought when it was on general file they amended out all the controversial issues, so I'm not real surprised that it passed." Heppner said.

In other action Thursday, the Unicameral by a four-vote margin defeated LB132, which would regulate school bus operations. The intent of the bill was to prohibit the operation of school buses if passengers exceeded the manufacturer's rated maximum seating

LB198, which deals with workmen compensation, was returned to select file for an amendment by Sen. Herb Duis. The legislature also passed LB306, 317 and 317a.
