Bloch ends Symphony season

A performance of Ernest Bloch's "Avodath Hakodesh" by the University Symphony Orchestra and Oratorio Choir will close the 1974-75 concert season for the UNL School of Music. The free recital is Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Coliseum.

Emanuel Wishnow will conduct the orchestra in his last major appearance before his scheduled retirement in July.

A milestone in the history of liturgical music,

"Avodath Hakodesh," or "Morning Service," was completed by Bloch in 1933 and performed the following year.

It is the first large scale choral-orchestral composition written for Jewish worship by a major composer. The text is taken from the Union Prayer Book for Jewish Worship.

Baritone Roger Stephens, assistant professor of voice, will be soloist. Earl Jenkins will direct the Oratorio Choir.

Scenes from five operas will be presented in a free concert Saturday by the UNL Opera Workshop. The program, at 8 p.m. in the Westbrook Music Building, is the finale in a week-long series of performances.

About 40 students, under the direction of Richard Grace and Roger Stephens, will present scenes from the Mozart operas "Cosi fan Tutti," "Marriage of Figaro" and "Don Giovanni."

Scenes from Menotti's "Old Maid and the Thief" and "Lucia de Lammermoor" by Donizetti also will be sung. All selections will be sung in English.

The students have performed all week in schools in Nebraska towns such as Beatrice, Wymore and Fairbury.
