

Symposium planned to explain 'Eastern wisdom'

Acupuncture, a sarod player and Eastern philosophies will be part of the Wisdom of the East, a two-week symposium sponsored by the Nebraska Union Human Potentials Committee.

According to Sara Boatman, program adviser for the Human Potentials Committee (HPC), the purpose of the symposium, which runs from Sept. 15-28, is to make people aware of the HPC and to enlarge upon the "rebirth in interest in Eastern philosophy."

"We wanted to show that there are many influences and impacts that Eastern philosophies have had on Western culture," Boatman said.

First year

The committee, in its first year as part of the Union Program Committee (UPC), has received \$4,000 from the Fees Allocation Board (FAB) to pay for the symposium.

Sunseed, a 90-minute documentary film on Eastern philosophies, will be the first feature and will be shown Sept. 15-17 in the Nebraska Union Main Lounge continuously from noon to 6 p.m. It also will be shown at 7:30 p.m. in the Union Small Auditorium. All showings are free.

The film will present the words and lifestyles of 10 international spiritual leaders to show influences of Eastern philosophy and spiritualism on the West.

Five-O actor

Khig Alx Dheigh, probably best known as Wo Fat on Hawaii Five-O, will speak on "Acupuncture and Aspects of I Ching" Sept. 18 at 3:30 p.m. in the Union Ballroom. Dheigh currently is director of the I Ching Institute in Los Angeles.

Dheigh will conduct informal sessions at 1 p.m. in the Lutheran Student Center, 538 N. 16th St., and at 7:30 p.m. in the Centennial College Commons Room, Neihardt Residence Center, 540 N. 16th

St.

An Indian sarodist, Ali Akbar Khan, will perform in concert Sept. 23 at 8 p.m. in the Union Centennial Room. The sarod is a 25-string Indian instrument composed of major and sympathetic strings and played with a coconut shell pick. Audience members are asked to bring pillows or mats to add to the mood of the music, Boatman said. Tickets are \$1.50 for UNL students and \$2.50 for general admission and will be sold at the door.

Awakening

The final event of the symposium will be Ram Dass speaking on "The Process of Spiritual Awakening." A former psychotherapist and researcher in LSD and other drugs, Dass also has written two books, *Be*

Here Now and The Only Dance There Is.

His program will be in Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery's Sculpture Gardens Sept. 28 at 3 p.m. In case of rain, it will be in the Union Centennial Room. There is no admission charge.
