



Photography at Sheldon Gallery

Thirty-eight photographs of rural Kentucky by Maggie MacKichan are on display in Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery now through Nov. 2.

This is the first solo show for MacKichan, 27, who is in Lincoln writing a dissertation for a Master of Fine Arts degree from New Mexico University. She said the pictures, all in black and white, were mostly taken in a single county in eastern Kentucky.

"I'd known these people for two years before I ever photographed them," MacKichan said. She met the Kentuckians when she worked with them through a VISTA program during the summers of 1966 and '67, she said. But she rejects the role of a photographer crusading for her Appalachian subjects.

"I don't see these as people who need to be helped or patronized in any way," she said.

Documentary films have a poor record in commercial theatres. However, the management of the Hollywood Theatre has licensed an engagement of "Hearts and Minds" in spite of the previous track record of such films. In an era of bicentennial celebration, we cannot forget the "rhetoric of the effete corps of snobs," peace with honor, napalm, peace marches sit-ins, campus riots, Kent State, Eugene McCarthy, draft dodgers, Jane Fonda, peace signs, Viet Cong, Tet Offensive, DMZ, Calley, My Lai, ROTC, doves, hawks, Westmoreland, Cam Ranh Bay, Dien, LBJ, Nixon, Rusk, McNamara, Agnew - the names, the events, the slogans, all were an integral part of day-to-day living during an era forgotten by many. The film's maker, Peter Davis ("The Selling of the Pentagon") has taken 150 hours of footage and reduced it to 112 minutes of the most intense film ever produced. We do not take a stand on the merits of the film politically or morally; we merely present the film in its entirety.
