HPC sets goals, decides deadline

The Housing Police Committee (HPC) presented objectives and a Dec. 11 deadline to members of an HPC differentiated housing task force Thursday night at the Nebraska Union.

Differentiated housing includes all aspects of living in any campus housing unit, including residence halls, cooperatives, fraternities and sororities.

HPC Chairman Don Thompson presented the task force with objectives as presented to a CSL meeting earlier this fall by UNL Housing Director Richard Armstrong.

The objectives made by HPC were "to evaluate implementation of "Differentiated Housing" as authorized by the Board of Regents, April 30, 1974; and to recommend adjustments to that program which would be in the best interests of students living in UNL residence units..."

The Regents' authorization was based on recommenda-

tions made to them by a differentiated housing task force organized in the fall of 1973. Tim Evensen chaired the task force which included faculty, staff and students.

The task force will be funded by the housing office, HPC member Jim Van Horn said. HPC requested funding from CSL adn administratoion offices, but it was decided it should be included under housing, and that financial support from the housing office would not bias the committee.

Committee members and the groups they represent are Carolyn Grice, Council on Student Life; Frank Thompson, ASUN; Glen Schumann, housing; Sally VanZandt, faculty: Beth Troester, cooperatives; Eric Chapman, Inter-fraternity Council; Mary Duryea, Panhellenic; Ray Walden, Dave Pillard, and Karen Lundquist, RHA; Kent Bliss and Henry Nuxall, Student assistants; Jim Van Horn and Ed Robinson, HPC; and Phil Layne, staff. Another RHA representative still needs to be selected.

The task force did not select a chairman, but will wait until a meeting early next week. Kent Bliss accepted temporary chairmanship to organize initial meetings.
