

# UNL Law College training to be cross-examined

At least four of the 26 subjects that appear on the Nebraska Bar Exam are not taught at the UNL College of Law, according to one senior law student who wishes to remain anonymous.

Agency, equity, insurance and partnership are the four areas of study he cited. He said any knowledge garnered on these subjects through individual research is not enough to allow a student to pass the exam.

Since the last exam administered in June, some law students have called the exam's grading and questioning unfair.

To help matters, an attempt is being made to bring Bar Commission members and law students together before the Jan. 19 and 20 exam to discuss apparent discrepancies.

### Bar commissioners invited

Student Bar Association (SBA) President Gene Crump is writing letters to the seven bar commissioners, inviting them to an informal meeting at the Law College Nov. 15.

After commissioners and law faculty members met informally Oct. 11 and discussed the exam, College of Law Dean Henry Grether said he thought such a meeting would benefit students.

Because commissioners have expressed a willingness, and were receptive to the idea,

Grether said, he thinks the informal, unstructured meeting will be a candid one, helping to answer law student's questions.

Saying he thinks the upcoming meeting will be "pointed and heated" questioning of bar commissioners, he said they will have to "justify" grading policies.

A junior law student, also wishing to remain anonymous, said he thinks the meeting will acquaint students with the exam's details.

### Not in tune

"The UNL law curriculum is not in tune with the Nebraska Bar Exam," he said. "It is not fair for the exam to include subjects that students are not taught."

The junior also questioned grading of exams. He said a law professor calculated that from the number of exams (some 150 from UNL alone), the number of examiners and graders (about five or six) and the number of days spent grading (about three), that each exam could not be read thoroughly.

These are the matters bothering law students.

Crump said the meeting should help dispel student doubts and answer questions.

### Proficient in law

He said he thinks the fact that commissioners will meet with students will "prove to the public that the people who pass the

exam are qualified and proficient in law."

Grether said "taking the Bar exam is a traumatic experience for most students. Seven years of education is riding the line." Of the coming meeting, he said, "If I were taking the exam, there would be things I would want to know."

Nebraska Bar Commissioners invited to the meeting are: Daniel Jewell, Omaha; James Shamberg, Grand Island; Lewis Ricketts, Lincoln; John North, Omaha; Charles Baskins, North Platte; Otto Wellinsiek, Nebraska City and George Turner, Lincoln.

## Melodramas aid AUF fund

The All University Fund (AUF) has added \$1,500 to its fund thanks to the Acacia and Pi Beta Phi melodramas staged last week.

Burke Hinds, director of the melodrama, said the five performances brought in 850 people, which added up to almost \$2,000. Expenses totaled between \$450 and \$500.

The melodrama idea originated about four years ago as a pledge class project.

Each year Acacia has produced the melodrama with a different sorority.

Hinds said four of the five performances were sold out, with the fifth performance "very close to being sold out." Because of the melodrama's growing popularity, he said next year Acacia may have to add another performance and raise prices.

"It is going to be around for a long time," concluded Hinds.
