This column will bring you television and movie highlights for the coming week.

**Monday**  
**Sandberg's Lincoln, Part V, "Crossing Fox River."** (NETV, 7 p.m.) This episode features a beleaguered Pres. Abraham Lincoln (Hal Holbrook), trying to maintain his integrity while his backers, to get votes, make campaign promises Lincoln cannot keep.  
**Eleanor and Franklin.** (ABC, 8 p.m.) The conclusion of the two-part dramatization of Joseph P. Lash's Pulitzer Prize-winning biography stars Jane Alexander as Eleanor and Edward Herrmann as FDR.

**An Imaginative Woman.** (NETV Play of the Month, 9:30 p.m.) In this Thomas Hardy play, Claire Bloom plays Ella, an aspiring poet who fantasizes an affair with a man she has never seen.

**Tuesday**  
**Search for the Great Apes.** (NETV National Geographic Special, 6:30 p.m.) Richard Kiley narrates this documentary shot in Borneo and the highlands of Africa's Rwanda of wild orangutans and gorillas.
