

bill board | Hearings on bills begin Thursday

Legislative committees begin public hearings on new bills Thursday. Notices of hearings and bills to be heard will be printed regularly in the Daily Nebraskan. All hearings begin at 2 p.m. unless otherwise noted.

Bicyclists may be interested in a Public Works Committee hearing Thursday on LB 628. That bill would repeal what Lincoln Sen. Roland Luedtke called "the most ridiculous law passed by the Legislature two years ago."

The law required that all bicycles be equipped with reflective tires after Jan. 1, 1976. He said some senators and state and local safety groups may want to amend or retain other provisions of the law requiring bicycle reflectors.

A spokesman for a local bike shop said he and other dealers will speak for repeal of the law. He said reflective tires are more expensive, but are of inferior quality compared to regular tires.

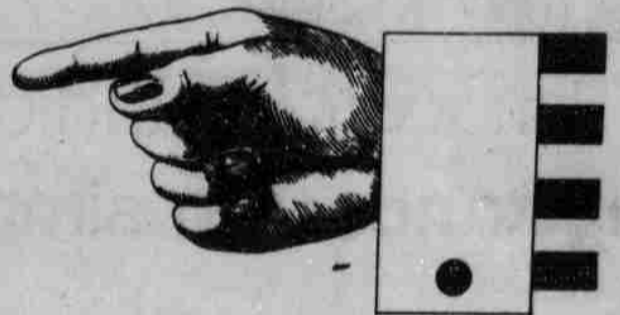
