Amendment would extend bail denial rights

The Legislature's Constitutional Revision and Recreation committee Friday will hear LB808, which relates to the Bill of Rights and provides additional situations when bail may be denied, at 1:30 p.m. in the Supreme Court Hearing Room 2414.

If the Legislature passes LB808, an amendment to Nebraska's Constitution guaranteeing reasonable bail except in cases of murder and treason, will be placed on the general election ballot in November.
