BYD is sponsored by the Speech Communication Association and the National Endowment for the Humanities, a federal agency. Debate topics center around the

Although sectional winners originally were promised scholarships, they only received bronze medallions Saturday.

UNL Debate Coach James Klumpp said the Nebraska Bicentennial Commission, which was to provide the funds for awards, has not yet taken action on the financing grant.

In the fourth round of debates, Hall will participate with students from Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas and Illinois.
