

Old Activities Bldg. will not be vacant

Although the East Campus Activities Bldg. no longer will house its student union after the new structure is completed next spring, the building will not be empty or silent.

Agriculture College Dean T.E. Hartung said he is forming a student committee to plan uses for the building. The committee was formed by a recommendation from the East Campus Faculty Advisory Council, according to Council Chairman Robert Sorensen, professor of agronomy.

Sorensen said the recommendation for a planning committee came "from a real concern about the fate of the Activities Bldg." once the new union is completed.

Hartung said the building might serve as a recreation center and a location for intramural athletics.

One problem faced by the committee is financing proposed programs, he said.

"The bookstore and snack bar brought in some revenue for financing activities, though it was inadequate," he said. "When these facilities are moved to the new (East) Union, another source of funding will have to be found to support the Activities Bldg."

According to Hartung, if the programming is academically related, state funds might be used. In addition, he said, recreational activities might use a combination of state money and fees.

Design students busy in Omaha

Two Omaha groups have asked UNL architecture students to help rejuvenate deteriorating parts of downtown and north Omaha.

In the architecture Design of Behavioral Patterns course, two students are creating designs to remodel the first floor of downtown Omaha's vacant J.C. Penney store, and eight students are designing a renovation of 38 acres near Creighton University.

Downtown Omaha Inc. requested the students' help in the Penney's store project, said Ted Wright, Community Resource and Research director. Omaha Wesley House asked for the Architecture Dept.'s help on the

Creighton University area project, he said.

Wright said Downtown Inc. asked the students to design a "village-type" shopping area for the first floor of the building which Penney's vacated last spring.

Wright called the building an "excellent facility" for the collection of small shops being planned for the site. He added that no large department store is interested in moving there. Currently Brandeis is downtown Omaha's only remaining large department store, he said.

In the Creighton University area project, students are designing a housing project northeast of the Creighton Health Complex currently being completed.

Because of the new health complex, Wright said the area needs housing for patients and their visitors, students, professionals and outpatients. More than 100 homes now occupy that land, most of which is vacant, he added.

North Omaha needs new construction to bring new people into the area, Wright said.
