March 3 is student host deadline

UNL student host applications for summer orientation must be submitted to the dean of the applicants college by March 3.

Summer orientation, which runs from June 8 through July 10, includes one-day sessions, which are designed to acquaint new students with UNL, said Dennis Martin, junior law student from St. Edwards.

Students and parents are given a look at UNL's social, physical and academic set-up, he said.

The cost for summer orientation session is about \$30,000, which includes salaries for nine faculty members, 14 student hosts and a business assistant and office supplies and materials, Martin said.

The \$30,000 comes from student fees and a \$6 registration fee paid by those attending the session, he added. Mary Dean, coordinator of UNL's community involve-

ment services, said about 1,000 new students attend summer orientation, which means about \$24,000 of the \$30,000 comes from student fees and about \$6,000 from registration fees.

Usually about 250 UNL students apply for summer host positions, Dean said. She added that an interview committee (comprised of one faculty member, one non-returning host, one ASUN Senate representative and Dean), selects the 14 student hosts. The committee tries to select a group which is representative of UNL's colleges, Dean said.

Requirements for the host position include an ability to demonstrate communication skills, working knowledge of academic requirements, courses and programs within at least one college, general understanding of UNL's social and cultural resources, past performance record of the students' leadership and an ability to respond spontaneously to situations requiring tact and diplomacy, according to Dean.

Interviews will be March 15 and 16 and students will be notified by March 18 of the interview committee's selection.
