

Temporary process for choosing Yell Squad is set

A temporary selection process for new UNL Yell Squad members has been decided, said ASUN Arts and Sciences Sen. Earl Singh.

Singh said he and William Murphy, squad sponsor and assistant professor of physical education and recreation, decided on the process Tuesday.

Under the selection plan, one member each from the NU Marching Band, Corn Cobs and Tassels spirit groups and a non-returning member of the current Yell Squad each will have a three-fourths vote on candidates, Singh said. Candidates' names then will be submitted to Murphy for approval. If Murphy disapproves of a candidate, the selection committee and Murphy will discuss his objections. If they reach no agreement, the committee will submit another candidate's name to Murphy.

Singh said each group will choose a selection committee member by whatever method it desires. He said committee members should know the yells and routines, use objectivity and integrity and be able to participate in the entire selection process.

The temporary process will be used this spring to select next year's Yell Squad members, Singh said. A permanent process is under discussion and will not be decided upon until ASUN Senate representatives meet with Ken Bader, vice-chancellor for student affairs. He said a decision probably will be made by the end of the current semester.

Murphy previously chose new Yell Squad members after tryouts. The Senate recommended at its Feb. 25 meeting that Murphy choose new members with the help

of a committee comprised of one member each from the band, Corn Cobs, Tassels and current yell squad. The recommendation also said Murphy and selection committee members would each have one vote in the selection.

However, Singh said Murphy rejected that idea.
