

Law grads buck national trend by 'finding jobs'

Inconsistent with the national trend, Nebraska law school graduates are finding jobs, according to law school deans.

Only two of last May's 47 UNL Law College graduates remain unplaced, Dean Henry Grether said, and one of those was restricted by the Nebraska State Bar Association.

Jackie Mass, placement director at Creighton University, said 92 per cent of last May's graduates have jobs, and less than one per cent are in "non-legal positions."

A recent Omaha World-Herald article said 10 to 20 per cent of the nation's 31,000 law graduates last June have no jobs.

Not one area of law has an abundance of job openings, Grether said, but "any graduate with an accounting back-

ground has not had any difficulty in getting a job."

Mass said the Internal Revenue Service is "always looking" for law graduates, and students with general law practice backgrounds "can just about go anywhere."

"Many are going out-of-state," she said, "but it is hard to tell if it is by choice or necessity."

Mass also said not as many jobs exist for lawyers in larger cities.

Grether said graduates "do best if they do what they want to do," and shouldn't specialize just because a specialized job exists.

"The largest number (of graduates) go into private law practice with established law firms," he said. "The market is worst back East. The Midwest doesn't experience the fun of booms; we are on an even keel."
