Day care centers plan radio raffle

Raffle tickets for a citizen's band radio, valued at \$160, go on sale today by the People for the Children, a UNL student parents group working to support the UNL day care centers.

Second and third prizes in the raffle are a \$40 and a \$20 gift certificate at the "store of your choice," said Mary Jo Ryan, director of University Day Care Centers. Tickets will be sold from today until April 19, she said, and the drawing will be April 21.

According to Ken Brand, a senior electrical engineering major from Sutherland and chairperson of

the raffle committee, the raffle's purpose is to raise \$500 to \$600 for staff expenses, food for children, toy repairs and other general-purpose centers' expenses.

The committee will try to obtain a Nebraska Union booth for ticket sales, Brand said, and parents of children in the day care centers also will sell tickets.

The University Day Care Centers, located at UMHE Commonplace, 333 N. 14th St. and First Plymouth Church, 21 and D streets, serve low-income university students and receive little direct UNL financing, Brand said.

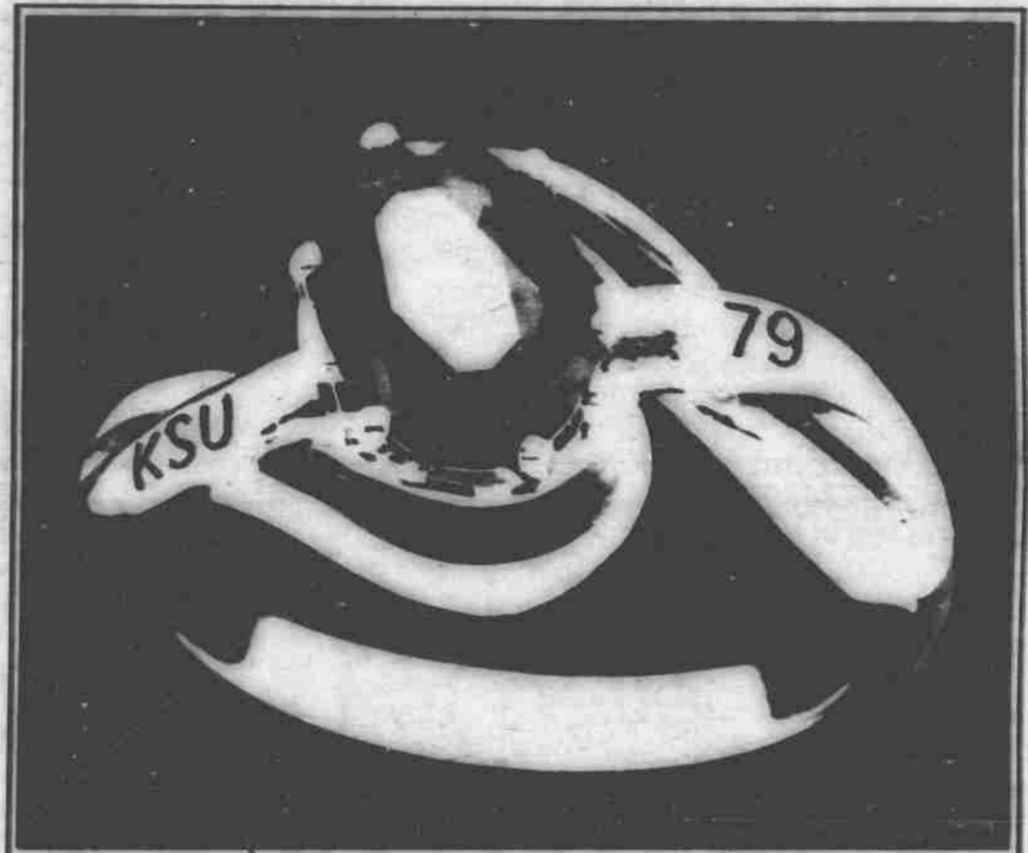
