Spring break is a good time for UNL students to register so they will be eligible to vote in the upcoming May primary, said Sue Ihne, spokesman for a group of students trying to oust some NU Board of Regents members.

lhne, a junior journalism major from Amarillo, Texas, said the nameless group is urging students to vote against incumbent regents Robert Koefoot of Grand Island, and Omahans Robert Prokop and James Myolan who are up for re-

The group, comprised of what Ihne

called "concerned students," Koefoot, Moylan, and Prokop are not working in the UNL student's interest. she said.

Ihne said her group was planning to call all university students to urge them to register, but the plan fell through because there was not enough time before spring

She said spring vacation is a good time for students to register because most of them will be in their home counties. Some students will not get a chance to register again before May, she said.
