Concert will emit homemade sounds

Thunks, scrapes and clatters of homemade instruments, along with traditional drum sounds, will be heard at the free concert of the UNL School of Music Percussion Ensemble 8 p.m. Monday.

Albert Rometo, UNL assistant professor of percussion, said almost every percussion instrument in the School of Music will be used. But since the music required more, Rometo and his students produced:

—halves of coconut shells, suspended hollow-side down into buckets of water. The shells are tapped with a keyboard mallet to produce "thunky, resonant" sounds.

—notched rasping sticks that are held to a wood resonating box and scraped with a drum stick.

—egg cartons filled with navy beans that are shaken to produce a "delicate clatter."

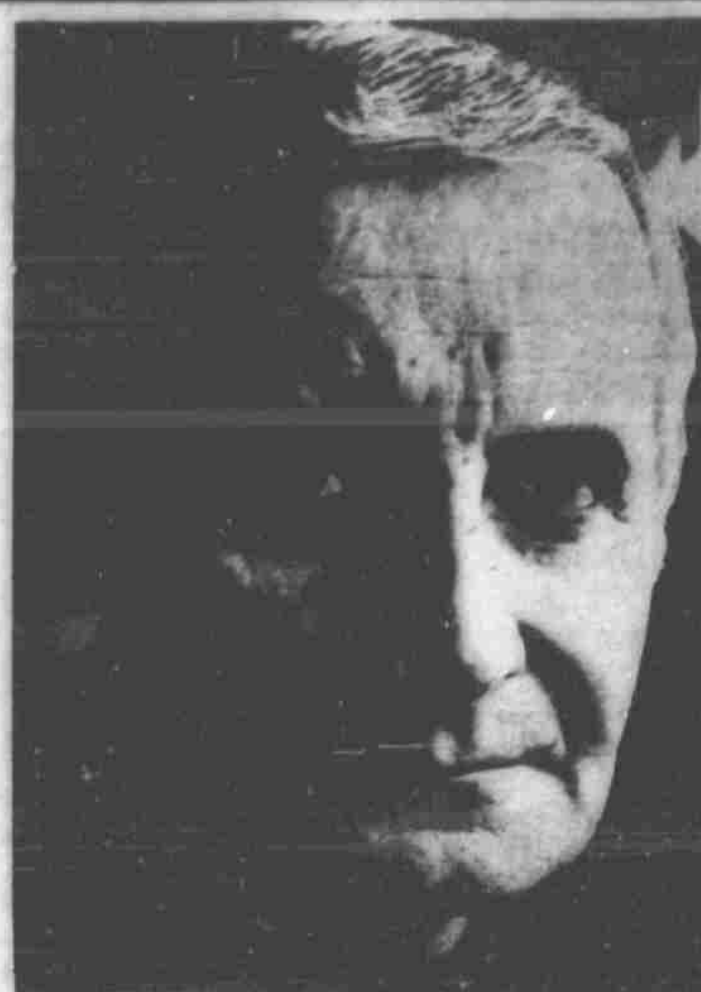
