A golden anniversary is cause for the celebration of the Phi Upsilon Omicron (Phi U) home economics honorary Friday and Saturday.

Phi U, established at UNL 50 years ago, will conduct discussions, seminars and workshops at the Nebraska Center for Continuing Education, 33rd and Holdrege streets.

Events Friday include a noon luncheon, four afternoon seminars and an evening recognition dinner.

The noon luncheon will feature a talk by national Phi U President Velma Everhart, as well as the presentation of a momento to the College of Home Economics by the Phi U alumnae.

Afternoon seminars at 2 will feature:

Dept., speaking on textiles and clothing.

Helen Noyes of Lincoln will make a "Historical Presentation on Nebraska Founders" after the evening recognition dinner, in the Omaha Room.

Saturday's 8 a.m. breakfast will feature speaker Christine C. Gropps, who has been involved with nutrition programs in India, El Salvador and Korea for the past five years.

The panel discussion on "Actualizing our Commitment for Today," 10 a.m. Saturday, will be conducted by Rhoda C. Chaloupka, former Callaway (Neb.) Courier editor; Beatrice D. David, food science professor at the University of Wisconsin in Madison; Shirley M. White, communication arts professor at Cornell University; and Phyllis S. Krohn, child care program teacher at Southeast Community College.

Luncheon events include presentation of the home economics alumnae award and a speech by Esther Meacham, home economics professor at Ohio State University.

According to UNL Home Economics dean Hazel Anthony, Phi U "recognizes undergraduates whose scholarship, leadership and service in home economics are exemplary."
