Sharpe, in responding to Miltenberger's charges, said "I don't consider all of it to be true. I'm disappointed, I thought we were fair."

"We always try to put our nine best players out there to win," Sharpe said. "He (Miltenberger) lacked a little talent, but he wouldn't agree. I think he is a disappointed young man trying to make himself look good."

Commenting on allegations about lack of discipline on road trips, Sharpe said he prefers to treat his players as

"We have no set training rules," he said. "We don't go around looking for trouble.

"You're always going to get dissatisfied players now and then," Sharpe said. "We try to treat every kid equal. We're sorry he quit."

Athletic Director Bob Devaney said he had not heard of Miltenberger's letter or allegations, but said he thought it was the opinion of a dissatisfied individual.

"I haven't heard all of the details, but every coach runs into an individual who wants publicity that he hasn't earned," Devaney said.


