CBA gets help

Nebraska insurance organizations have contributed \$1.575 to the College of Business Administration (CBA) for the purchase of library materials on insurancerelated topics.

This is the first step in a five-year plan for the Nebraska insurance industry to help upgrade the college's insurance education program. A committee chaired by E.J. Faulkner, president of Woodmen Accident and Life Co., in Lincoln, is working with CBA Dean Ronald Smith in mapping out the five-year proposal.

Faulkner said that the cooperative effort will result in more and better-trained graduates available for employment in the insurance industry.

The plan calls for assessment of educational needs, recruitment and support of additional faculty members and organization of additional courses.

Shakespeare play opening

Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream" will open Friday, July 9 at Howell Theater, 12th and R. streets.

The comedy will also be presented Saturday, July 10, Monday, July 12 and Wednesday, July 14. The play, a Nebraska Repertory Theater production, will begin at 8 p.m. each day.

The plot for "A Midsummer Night's Dream" involves two pairs of lovers who venture from a castle into a woods inhabited by fairies. The king of the fairies is Oberon, whose servant, Puck, is responsible for much of the mischief, hence the hilarity, of the play. William Kirk, director of the play, said he will try to "present the play as clearly as possible," so that even those unfamiliar with Shakespeare will have no trouble following the action.

Lower enrollment

More than eight thousand students enrolled at UNL during the first three 1976 nummer sessions.

There are 6,556 students attending a 5-week session which will end Friday, July 9; 481 are enrolled in the 8-week session, also ending July 9 and 1,862 enrolled in

the three-week session completed June 4.

The 1976 summer school enrollment so far is over 200 less than the 9,168 record enrollment last summer, according to William Sesow, associate director of summer sessions.

The second five-week session begins July 12. About 5,000 students are expected to attend this session, Sesow said.
