## Better service, cost cuts push CSO, Rec merger

The UNL center for Students and Organizations (CSO) and the Recreation Dept. have been combined this fall to provide more efticient service to students and to cut operation costs, said Dan Steller, CSO director.
The combination is a resilt of discussion between
officils from the Office of Student Development and Student Affairs, Steller said.

The CSO, Nebracka Union 200, plans freshman orientrtion and operates the Student Onganization Bank, which handles all student organization business trameactions, and officers of chity Involvement Services. It ano edios procedures, and helps people begin new student groups.

Too specialized'
Steller said he thinks the CSO and the Recreation Dept. alone were "too specialized." He said he hopes the merger will end that specialization and give the students a central location to learn about all campus activities.

He added that other campus activity offices may merge if this proves successful.

Although the Recreation Dept. staff still is located at 17th and Vine streets, the staffs of the two offices were combined and their jobs redefined, Steller said.

The consolidated offices makes the employes' iobs easier, he said. Instead of the Recreation Dept. handling tion bank, the CSO now can handle all bookkeeping for the Recreation Dept., he said.

No additional staff members were hired when the No additional staff members were hired when the he said, no new faclities were needed to accomodate the enlarged department.

The Flights and Study Tours and Overseas Student Asmociation offices, formerly located in the csO office, were reasigned to Nebrata Union 345 and combined with the Intemational Educational Services office.

People from the reorgnized CSO ofice are looking for a name to describe the services they provide to students. Steller said he is "not entirely satisfied" with the sparate titles. of the offices.

In addition to restructuring their office, CSO officints ako devised a new plan to assits student organizations. Groups now can take material they need mimeographed to CSO and employes will reproduce them at no diagge to the club. The organization must provide paper.

Information brought to the CSO office by 10 am. probably will be printed by 3 pm . the same day, he said. Hie added the groups must prepare their own stencils.
